1. Purpose



- What are we trying to achieve?
- Instrumentalist

Economic growth; state and markets; institutions of title + contract; topdown; 'thin' reforms [Weber, North...] (World Bank/MDG's)

Constitutive

Human-centred; freedom, opportunity, equality, rights; participation; bottom-up; 'thick' reforms [Rawls, Sen ...] (UNDP, Danida ...)

• Others

Rule of law +/- democracy (USAID); good governance (WBI, TI); safety + security, post-conflict (DfID) ...

2. Leadership

- Ownership: whose agenda?
- Home-grown reforms
- Pro-active role
- Access to justice
 - A2J to the courts
 - A2J through the courts
- Managing the human factor





3. Independence

- Integration in national reform agenda
- Critical, sensitive, complex, nuanced

SSJR - L.Armytage

- Engagement *not* isolation
- Key relationships
 - Executive
 - Community
 - Donors
- Collaborative partnerships





- Inclusion: who are reform stakeholders?
- Leadership + participation
 - Ownership, authenticity, sustainability
 - Needs assessment, implementation, evaluation
- Supply + demand sides
- Coalitions: non-state actors + civil society
- Pro-poor development

5. Donors



- Whose agenda (again)?
- Role support and facilitation
- Planning, local systems
 - Monterrey (2002), Marrakech (2004), Paris (2005), Accra (2008)
- Coordination, competition
- Sustainability dependence, feasibility
- Change management: realistic time-frames
- Organisational learning ...

6. Training + Development



- Indispensable but insufficient
- Integration with related strategies
 - Incentives for behavioural change
 - Structural + systemic reforms
- Pedagogy educational effectiveness
- Judges as learners
- Training-of-Judge Trainers (ToJT)
- Court-owned, judge-led



- What is capacity-building?
- Limits of short-term assistance
- Transitional strategies for generational change
 Human rights, gender equality, corruption, impunity ...
- Resource scarcity; development cost



- Critical interdependency reform packages
- Size + complexity = difficulty
 - feasibility, not resources
- Towards sector-wide approaches (SWAps)
 - latest elixir?



- Getting more serious: empirical approach
- Accurate accessible reliable data
 - research
 - analysis
 - monitoring
 - evaluation
- Keeping IT simple feasible solutions
- Evidence-based decision-making

10. Results

- Lack of results, or evidence?
- Evaluate what?
 - accountability v effectiveness
 - process v results
- Evaluate how?
 - scientific v participatory
 - causality, attribution
 - time, cost, rigour
- Purpose + results: planning + evaluation

- Courts are seizing reformist role to improve justice
- Orthodoxy economic development, good governance, safety and security
- Emerging equality, opportunity, fairness, rights
- Evidence of development merit and potential
- One size does *not* fit all
- Uneven, fragile foundations

Frontier Issues

- Improve data, empirical approach
- Learning by doing
 innovation, evaluation, refinement
- Engagement with stakeholders
- Political-economy factors influences of political institutions, economic systems and law
- Focus on effectiveness, results.
